Minutes: Minutes of the Nov. 19, 2009 minutes were read. Michael Shreve moved the acceptance of the minutes as read – seconded by Helen Lightfoot – motion carried.

Correspondence: Letter from the Department of Transportation, finally located after being missing since Dec. 2008, was circulated and is now safely filed in the correspondence book.

Treasurers Report: Treasurer, Fred Houghton was absent from the meeting and his report was presented by co-chair, Dave.

Old Business:

Flag: There was some discussion re Hall's Harbour community flag and how the competition for design of the flag might be carried out. Carman felt the competition should be limited to schools in the area and that H.H.C.D.A. should provide some guidelines – flag size, number of colours, etc.

Community Welcome Sign: Dave said H.H.C.D.A. has applied for money for this project through the Councillor's Discretionary Funding program. He also said there are posts available and Carman has a source for the design of the sign. Dave urged all directors to contact councillor Killam requesting that he give favourable consideration to our request.

Wharf Bench: Dave is still working on this project. It was suggested some funding might be available through a Projects For Seniors program. Additional funding may come from memorial plaques.

Summer Student: Sylvia said we have received a phone call from Service Canada stating we will be getting funding for a summer student. This has not yet been confirmed in writing. Carman has very kindly offered to assist with supervision of the student.

Hall's Harbour – Canada Day: There was considerable discussion regarding whether or not we will be able to proceed with Hall's Harbour – Canada Day celebrations this year. There was some suggestion that it might be necessary to defer the events for this year and hopefully carry on in 2011. During our discussion a phone call was received from J. Currie at Fundy View Community Club stating that F.V.C.C. would not be holding their chicken barbecue this year. Decision was deferred until next meeting.

New Business:

Bulletin Board: Moved by Carman Steele and seconded by Helen Lightfoot that the bulletin board that was located on the crib work heading down into the H.H. Lobster Pound be replaced with a new, smaller board. Motion carried with one "NO" vote (Sylvia).

Binoculars: Dave put the binoculars up and for the time being he is taking care of removing the money and delivering same to treasurer, Fred Houghton. Dave will approach Dave and Sandra Houghton re their willingness to take on this task for the summer.

Trail: Dave announced that the amount of \$5,500. has been received from the Municipality of Kings for the purpose of trail improvement. There will be new signage, picnic tables, etc. Dustin Keizer is once again available to work on the trail a few days each week.

Student Bursary: Heather will call the school board with regard to the bursary. The subject was raised about students from the Hall's Harbour area who attend schools other than NEKEC – are they considered eligible, etc. Also, it was suggested we should research the criteria re granting the bursary and how the H.H.C.D.A initially became involved with this project.

Lighthouse Wharf: Gary Hubbard, area manager, D.F.O. has advised that an engineer will be coming to Hall's Harbour on other business and will look at the Lighthouse Wharf at that time.

Tide Gauge: Sylvia said the tide measure stick that was fastened to the wharf has been washed out to sea. Since this is a very popular item with visitors, it was suggested a new one be put in place. Dave will look into this.

Adjournment: On motion by Helen, meeting adjourned at 8:50 pm. Next meeting will be May 27, 2010 at the [H.H.C@P](#) Site.
